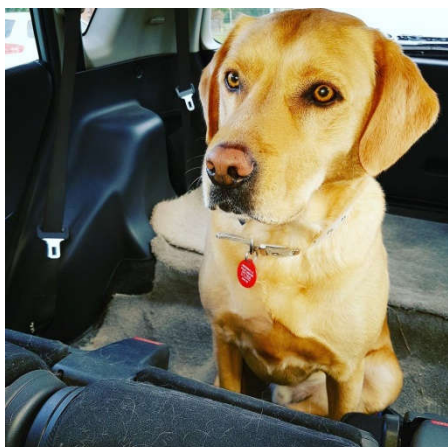
Things went wrong from the get go with Bosco, his fosterer couldn't take him as he got aggressive as soon as he got there with her dogs.

Immediately there were issues so we got a trainer out to help with Bosco and their report came back very positive and they gave the new owner instructions and tips on how to work with Bosco.

Things seemed to be going well until late one night I got a phone call to say Bosco had bitten her adult daughter in the face and she was in hospital. Bosco was put down the following day at the vets all by himself.

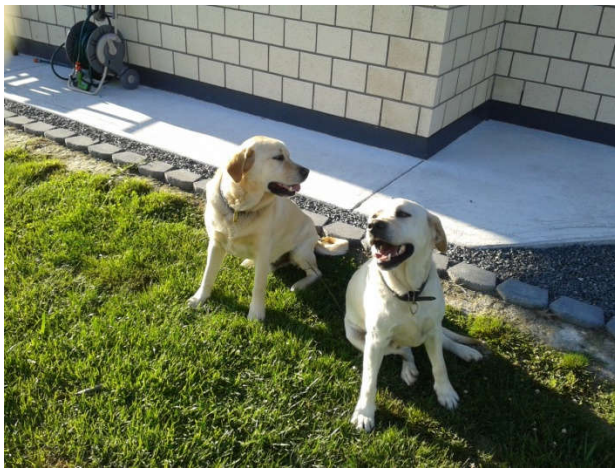
I understand you may be able to assist in re homing them
